USPSTF Seeks Comments on Cervical Cancer Screening

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) seeks comments on a draft recommendation statement and draft evidence review on screening for cervical cancer. The Task Force recommends screening most women ages 21 to 65 years for cervical cancer.
