Prevention and Risk Reduction	Whenever possible, prevent cancer from occurring. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Reduce exposure to tobacco and secondhand smoke (link). 2. Enhance opportunities for Iowans to access nutritious food and be physically active (link). 3. Decrease alcohol consumption (link). 4. Increase immunization rates for vaccines shown to reduce the risk of cancer and protect cancer patients from preventable diseases (link). 5. Prevent, diagnose, and treat hepatitis C virus (HCV) (link). 6. Reduce exposure to environmental carcinogens (link). 7. Decrease exposure to radon (link). 8. Reduce exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun and indoor tanning devices (link).
Screening and Early Detection	Promote the benefits of screening tests to ensure early diagnosis. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increase awareness of recommended cancer screenings (link). 2. Empower health care systems to strengthen cancer screening and diagnostic services (link). 3. Support strategies to increase access to cancer screening and diagnostic services (link). 4. Increase access to cancer risk assessment and genetic counseling services (link). 5. Enhance awareness and research support for the early detection of ovarian cancer (link).
Diagnosis and Cancer-Directed Therapy	Reduce barriers to care, promote evidence-based practices, and encourage participation in clinical trials and other forms of research. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Increase access to quality, evidence-based cancer treatment and affirming care (link). 2. Increase access to targeted therapy options for Iowans, including biomarker testing (link). 3. Enhance patient support services within the clinic (link). 4. Empower patients and providers to communicate about advance care planning early in the cancer treatment journey (link). 5. Increase patient and caregiver access to non-clinical support services (link).
