Increase immunization rates for vaccines shown to reduce the risk of cancer and protect cancer patients from preventable diseases (link). Prevent, diagnose, and treat hepatitis C virus (HCV) (link). Reduce exposure to environmental carcinogens (link). Decrease exposure to radon (link). Reduce exposure to ultraviolet (UV) radiation from the sun and indoor tanning devices (link). |
