

CANCER IN IOWA:

According to the Iowa Cancer Registry, Iowa's cancer incidence rate grew faster than any other state from 2016 to 2020, and Iowa continues to have the second-highest overall cancer incidence in the United States.

In 2024, the Iowa Cancer Registry estimates 21,000 Iowans will receive a cancer diagnosis and 6,100 Iowans will lose their lives to cancer.

The Iowa Cancer Consortium believes all Iowans have a unique role in reducing the state's cancer burden and have created the Iowa Cancer Plan to support this mission.


The Iowa Cancer Plan includes evidence-based policy interventions to address the state's high cancer burden. For example, one evidence-based way to reduce tobacco use and lower Iowa's high lung cancer incidence and mortality rates is to increase sales tax on all tobacco products.



The Iowa Cancer Consortium grew the state and federal investment by **25%** in FY23

Above + Beyond Cancer: Hotel Program

For the third year, Consortium funding supported the Above + Beyond Hotel Program, which provides free hotel rooms for cancer patients and their caregivers when they must travel 50 miles or more for treatment and have financial need. In FY23, the Hotel Program:

- Provided 762 nights of complimentary lodging near cancer centers in Des Moines, Iowa City, Mason City, Waterloo, Ames, and Carroll.
- Served 103 cancer patients (plus their caregivers) from 36 counties in lowa.





Crescent Community Health Center: Advancing Cancer Care for Black/African American Iowans

Consortium funding supported a Community Health Worker and the launch of a cancer prevention program for Black/African American community members living in Dubuque, Jackson, Delaware, Clayton, and Allamakee counties. In FY23, Crescent Community Health Center:

- Served over 1,600 Black/African American clients.
- Increased completion of up-to-date recommended cancer screenings for Black/African American clients by 5% over the previous year.





UnityPoint Health-Trinity: Colorectal Cancer Screening Outreach for High Risk Underserved Communities

Consortium funding supported education and at-home colorectal cancer screening tests (FIT kits) to uninsured, under-insured, and underserved Black, Latinx, and LGBTQ+ communities in Scott, Louisa, and Muscatine counties. In FY23, UnityPoint Trinity, in partnership with Gilda's Club Quad Cities:

- Distributed **659 FIT kits**, with 150 being returned by patients for testing.
- Found and followed up with 8 positive results.



Making Moves in Rural Cancer

In November 2022, the Iowa Cancer Consortium's Rural Cancer Workgroup was honored with the **Community Star Award** from the National Organization of State Offices of Rural Health.

In March 2023, the Workgroup launched the **Iowa Oncology Navigation Network (IONN)**, an online resource and networking hub for oncology navigation professionals in Iowa.
