For the third year in a row, the Iowa Cancer Registry reports high and rising cancer incidence rates in our state. Iowa has the second-highest cancer incidence rate in the country and is one of two states where rates are on the rise.

The Iowa Cancer Consortium is Iowa's statewide comprehensive cancer coalition. As a leader in cancer control, the Consortium offers cancer partners in Iowa access to resources, expertise, and non-competitive collaboration across traditional boundaries for a bigger impact in cancer prevention, early detection, treatment and quality of life.

The Iowa Cancer Consortium believes all Iowans have a unique role in reducing the state's cancer burden and have created the Iowa Cancer Plan to support this mission. The Iowa Cancer Plan includes evidence-based policy interventions to address the state's high cancer burden.

IOWA CANCER PLAN IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS FUNDED:

- Above + Beyond Cancer Hotel Program, which provided 823
 nights of complimentary lodging near cancer centers in Des Moines,
 lowa City, Mason City, Waterloo, Ames, and Carroll, to 102 cancer
 patients (plus their caregivers) from 37 counties in lowa.
- Crescent Community Health Center, which improved patient navigation for recommended cancer screenings to 1,600
 Black/African American clients in Dubuque, Jackson, Delaware, Clayton, and Allamakee counties, increasing cancer screening rates for this community by 20% over the previous year.
- Focus on Diabetes: Project Health, which spread education and awareness about prostate cancer to over 200 men in the Black community in Black Hawk, Johnson, and Linn counties.
- UnityPoint Health-Trinity, in partnership with Cancer Support Community Iowa & NW Illinois at Gilda's Club, which distributed 534
 FIT kits to underserved community members in Scott, Louisa, and Muscatine counties. 138 kits were returned for testing, and any positive results were followed up with for further testing and treatment.

SURVIVORSHIP SUPPLEMENT GRANTS FUNDED:

• A Time to Heal Cancer Foundation, which trained 18 providers from 6 healthcare systems in Survivorship 101 facilitation in Black Hawk, Clay, Des Moines, Fremont, Montgomery, and Page counties, equipping them to provide psychosocial support for cancer survivors and their caregivers.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- The Cancer Screening & Early Detection Workgroup launched a <u>Cancer Screening and Early</u> <u>Detection Toolkit</u> with plain language cancer screening information and a quick guide rack card.
- Together with our partners, we created a <u>Cancer Clinical Trials in Iowa</u> webpage where cancer patients and their families can find a comprehensive list of clinical trial sites in our state.
- Lead by member interest, we launched the Cancer & the Environment Task
 Force which brought public health and environmental health experts together over a series of <u>webinars</u> in 2024!
- Above + Beyond Cancer honored the Iowa Cancer Consortium and our members with the 2023 Celebrate! Award.
